## GLO Texas Archives: Genealogy Resources at the GLO

Did you know that the Texas General Land Office Archives has more than 35.5 million documents and over 45,000 maps and sketches, dating back to 1561? All dealing with the disposition of the public domain. The Texas General Land Office contains a wealth of genealogical resources for anyone researching ancestors who received an original Texas land grant.

This presentation gives a general overview of the Spanish collection and grants given under the Republic of Texas. Celebrate Texas History Month with us by learning about this great resource!

**Kevin Klaus** developed a love of history from an early age listening to stories told by his grandparents who grew up in East Texas. Over the past 30 years, he has collected and researched his own family, using government records, letters, photographs, family Bible information, and stories. Beginning in 1990, he served eight years in the United States Army before returning home to Central Texas. Kevin has a background in Anthropology, Archaeology, and Public History from the University of New Mexico. Over the last 21 years, he has served as one of the lead researchers in the Texas General Land Office Archives and Records Program Area, learning about the history of Texas and discovering the amazing collection of personal letters of early soldiers and pioneers who helped settle our great state.
